

Influenza Vaccination Technical Assistance Materials for Health Centers Curated by the Flu LEAD (Linkages to End Access Disparities) Team

In this unprecedented time of pandemic response, coupled with the 2020-2021 influenza season, prevention of respiratory disease transmission is a top public health priority. Increasing influenza vaccination coverage is a critical strategy for reducing respiratory disease burden, maintaining healthcare system capacity, and protecting populations at greater risk of negative outcomes. Influenza vaccination is especially important for racial and ethnic minorities, seniors, people with disabilities, and people with underlying conditions who are at elevated risk for complications from both influenza and COVID-19. Influenza vaccination is also highly important for Special Populations served by health center, such as residents living in public housing, migrant workers, and individuals experiencing homelessness.

The following technical assistance resources may be helpful to health centers and other Health Center Program stakeholders interested in supporting clinical and community efforts to increase seasonal influenza vaccination rates.
