- 1,373 Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHC) = **30 million patients**
- 458 FQHCs In or Immediately Accessible to Public Housing = **5.7 million patients**
- 108 Public Housing Primary Care (PHPC) = **911,683 patients**

HHS Fact Sheet: COVID-19 Public Health Emergency Transition Roadmap

Impact at a glance – Will NOT be affected:

- COVID-19 vaccinations and certain treatments, such as Paxlovid and Lagevrio
- FDA EUAs for COVID-19 products (including tests, vaccines, and treatments)
- Medicaid / Major Medicare telehealth flexibilities
- Buprenorphine for opioid use disorder treatment in Opioid Treatment Programs
- Expanded methadone take-home doses of opioid use disorder treatment

HHS Guidance on End of Public Health Emergency: February 9, 2023

HHS Fact Sheet: COVID-19 Public Health Emergency Transition Roadmap

Impact at a glance – WILL be affected:

- Coverage for COVID-19 testing for Americans
- Reporting for COVID-19 laboratory results & immunization data to CDC
- Certain Medicare and Medicaid waivers and broad flexibilities for health care providers
- Certain FDA COVID-19-related guidance documents for industry that affect clinical practice and supply chains will end or be temporarily extended
- FDA's ability to detect early shortages of critical devices related to COVID will be limited
- Public Readiness and Emergency Preparedness Act liability protections may be impacted
- The ability of providers to safely dispense controlled substances via telemedicine without an in-person interaction is affected; however, there will be rulemaking proposing extension
